The Jury is pleased to award the 2010 WEC Gold Medal for International Corporate Achievement in Sustainable Development to Wal-Mart Stores, Inc. for its commitment to alter the way products are sourced, manufactured, delivered, sold, and disposed in its own business operations and across its global supply chain. As the world's largest retailer, with 8,000 retail units and 100,000 suppliers, Walmart recognizes that its huge leverage and purchasing power will promote transparency and environmentally sensitive practices. The shift of direction will be achieved through its aggressive Signature Project - Building a More Responsible Supply Chain - assisted by the Responsible Sourcing Initiative and use of Sustainability Indexes.
